DANGER

Hazard Statements
Highly flammable liquid and vapor. Causes serious eye irritation.

Precautionary Statements
Keep away from heat, sparks, open flames, and hot surfaces. – No smoking. Keep container tightly closed. Ground/bond container and receiving equipment. Use explosion-proof electrical, ventilating, and lighting equipment. Use only non-sparking tools. Take precautionary measures against static discharge. Wash thoroughly after handling. Wear protective gloves, protective clothing and eye protection.

If on skin (or hair): Take off immediately all contaminated clothing. Rinse skin with water/shower. If in eyes: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. If eye irritation persists: Get medical advice/attention. In case of fire: Use dry chemical, CO₂, water spray or alcohol-resistant foam to extinguish.

Store in a well-ventilated place. Keep cool.

Dispose of contents/container in accordance with applicable regional, national and local laws and regulations.

Supplemental Information:

May be required based on the classification of the product. For example, the percentage of an ingredient in a product or ingredients with unknown toxicity.

*WHMIS Supplier Label needs to be in English and French.

What is this product?

1 Product Identifier

The name of the product; must be an exact match to the product name on the SDS.

3 Signal Word

'Danger' or 'Warning' is used to emphasize hazards and indicate severity of the product. Danger is more severe.

What are the hazards?

2 Pictograms

Hazard pictograms, determined by the hazard classification of the product. In some cases, no pictogram is required.

4 Hazard Statement

Brief standardized statements that describe the hazards of the product.

How do I work safely with the product?

5 Precautionary Statement

Describes recommended measures to minimize or prevent adverse effects from exposure, improper handling or storage, or a spill or fire.

Where to look for more information?

6 Supplier Identifier

The contact information for the company that made, packaged, sold, or imported the product.
